# Safely Home

## What is Safely Home?

**Safely Home** provides rapid and accurate identification and the safe return home of a person who has wandered. This person may have dementia or an intellectual disability.

**Safely Home** provides peace of mind for carers in home situations and health professionals caring for people in residential or respite facilities.

## The Safely Home bracelet

When you register with **Safely Home** the person at risk of wandering receives a personalised stainless steel bracelet to wear at all times. The bracelet features a toll free telephone number and personal identification number linked to the NSW Police **Safely Home** database. The secure bracelet is virtually impossible to remove without assistance.

## The Safely Home database

The **Safely Home** database is accessible by police 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It includes a detailed description of the person, contact information, previous residential addresses and locations the person may visit. All details on the database are confidential.

## How does it work?

When someone finds the lost person, they can look at the bracelet, telephone the police and quote the personal identification number. The police then make arrangements for the person to be returned safely home.

Carers can use **Safely Home** to instigate a search for the person with dementia by contacting their local police station and filing a Missing Persons Report. The police initiate a search using the information on the database.
